

## HER NAME WAS TRUTH

On May 29, 2024, the Sojourner Truth Plaza dedication and statue unveiling took place in Downtown Akron. The plaza is now open to the public seven days a week, from dawn to dusk. A path winding through the plaza displays important dates in Truth's life. The plaza also features a mural inspired by a famous 1864 photograph of Truth. The mural occupies the southeast wall of the plaza, alongside a metal sculpture of an Impala Lily.

In celebration of FCC's 190th Anniversary, longtime member Chris Godard generously offered to share some of his favorite memories of our church. The following is the third installment of Chris' recollection of times past.

#### AS WRITTEN AND TOLD BY CHRIS GODARD

I can remember when the church had a crazy but fun family event that went on for several years. We had a carnival upstairs in the present-day Upper Room. The cake walk was in the center of the floor, underneath all that carpeting, where there was a circular design. Beyond the cake walk, there were rooms on the first floor with fun activities. We fished for goldfish in bags on the ends of our hooks. Others bobbed for apples. Clowns were bopping around making faces, especially for us kids. They looked to me like old men under all that white, pasty makeup. Pink cheeks and red eyeliner filled out their faces. There was a crescent moon with a bench beside it. I have a

picture of my brother Geoff sitting right on that very bench with a red balloon in his hand. He watched the whole experience in awe.

At another carnival, a few years later, I won a pair of googly eyes made of metal. They were were blue and white eyeballs with a metal nose piece. I believe I still have them today. I must have fought gallantly to have won them by knocking down the bottles.



Here's the best part: The stage in the Upper Room used to have a heavy black velvet curtain with a basketball area behind it. Guess what? It was also made into a spook house. Loved it! There were crazy old men walking around in there trying to scare the yell out of us. Well, they did just that! We screamed bloody murder until we figured it all out and came away laughing our butts off. All in all, it was a grand and fun event that captured the hearts of our members of all ages.
