It is human nature to feel anxious about change, so let me begin by saying that most of the changes you see will be small, and all of them will be made in conversation with the leadership of this congregation. One of the things that was clear in your profile (and in your name) is the importance of congregationalism. I value that and not only want your input, but I also want to empower you to take responsibility for this church that you love.

One important change that I want to share with you is our plan to call a new Associate Minister. That position has historically been a hired position, and that was done through our Human Resources Board. Because of the congregational nature of our church, Pastor Jeff suggested that it be a called position, and I enthusiastically concur. That means that a search committee will need to be formed and that it will take some time. That means I will be managing solo for a while, so I ask for your patience and grace. The things which you are passionate about may not be at the top of my list right away, but it does not mean I do not hear you. I promise I will attend to them.

I am excited to be doing ministry with all of you, and as the prophet Isaiah reminds us, none of us are doing this alone; God is by our side.

SECOND SUNDAY SALADS RETURNS – LETTUCE REJOICE!



MEETINGHOUSE DOME ROOF REPAIR UPDATE

At our Spring Congregational Meeting, members approved an important repair to the Meetinghouse Dome roof, with authorization to use up to \$120,000 from the Endowment. We are pleased to share that the project has made excellent progress and is nearing completion.

In July, the interior of the dome was carefully protected by tarping off the area to shield the stained-glass dome during the work. By August, the structural repairs to the roof were completed, including enhancements to help prevent future water damage. September brought the start of the copper roof installation, which will be followed by the final step of adding foam insulation and a venting fan to guard against condensation and rot.

Thanks to the generosity of church members who contributed directly to this project, the financial outlook is brighter than anticipated. While the total project cost is estimated at \$110,000, the Endowment draw is expected to be only \$86,000-well below the amount originally approved.

The protective tarping over the dome will remain in place through the winter months as an added precaution. Come spring, once we are confident the repairs have weathered the season well, the tarping will be removed.
